The syllabus was unanimously approved by the Committee with following suggestions, which were incorporated in the meeting itself.

- a. A paper on Gender Studies/issues can be incorporated into the syllabus.
- b. To modify the syllabus of Hindi and make it media centric.

Prof. Rajan Mahan said that the syllabus of BA (J&MC) comprehensively covers the varied aspects of Journalism and Mass Communication and meets the media industries requirement.

The syllabus of the Semester I and Semester II has been approved and the syllabus of Semester III and IV are tentatively approved with some minor changes/suggestions/recommendations given are as under

- a) To incorporate some practical papers in Semester I and Semester II.
- b) The paper 'Global Media and Culture' in Semester I and 'Indian Cultural Communication' can be removed to include practical oriented papers.
- c) Basic/advance course in Print Media in Semester I and Basic/advance course in Video Production in Semester II can be introduced as practical oriented papers in place of the papers mention in para (b) above.
- III. Syllabus for Certificate Course in Acting (1 year)

Minutes of the Departmental Staff Committee Meeting held on 22nd May, 2015 at Board Room of Faculty Block 3 on 2.00p.m. The following were present in the meeting:

After reviewing the existing BA (J&MC) course structure, the Chair proposed to discuss some modifications in the course structure.

In this respect the committee identified that:

- The existing course structure consists theory-practical ratio of 70:30, whereas the media industry intakes candidates with practical experience.
- The committee also felt that the approach of teaching core subjects is very orthodox and is inapt to produce the required output.
- The committee held that few new subjects should be introduced as per the industry requirement & to retain the interest of students who have joined the course with great enthusiasm.
- The committee stressed that the last semester should be dedicated for specialization so that the students can have a practical work to show in their future endeavor.

After identifying the above problems the committee tabled some proposals.

- The committee first proposed to change the approach of course structure ratio from 70:30 theory-practical to 30:70.
- Secondly some subjects as Reporting, Writing for Mass Media, Editing etc. should be completely practical and the credits for courses with practical credits to be divided into 2-2 ratio. The committee also suggested dedicating practical classes to some existing theory courses viz. Event Management, PR & Corporate communication.
- Thirdly the committee proposed to introduce new subjects viz. Heritage & Cultural Tourism (I Sem); Visual culture (I sem); Documentary film(I Sem); Photography (II Sem); Basics of Video Production (III Sem); Film Appreciaiton & Asthetics (IV sem); Study of Traditional Media (IV Sem); Development of Cinema (V Sem) and a media project in either print/ electronic/online media along with its dissertation to make the course more competent.
- The committee planned to create a video archive in near future when the new studio is set up, for the interviews of all the dignitaries that visit MUJ.
