15AC (D-6-1) Revision of BA (Hons) Economics Programme:

The Council suggested to revisit the scheme, make changes as required and follow the standard format for scheme and syllabi.

In view of its offering from academic session 2016-17, the Council advised that the revised scheme and syllabi be placed before the Chairperson, Academic Council for consideration of approval.

15AC (D-6-2) Syllabi of Open Elective Courses:

The Council approved the syllabi of two open elective courses namely South Asian Studies and West Asian Studies. The courses will be offered by Department of Arts from academic session 2016-17.

The Council suggested that more inter faculty deliberation be under taken during preparation of syllabi of any course (s).

15AC (D-6-3) Certificate Courses:

The Council approved the proposal to offer certificate courses viz. Business English, Communicative English, German and French. Syllabi of these courses were also approved.

The Council suggested that Department of Languages and T& P cell should drive these programmes to improve / enhance verbal communication skills of the students in line, with the demand of industry.
