1. INTRODUCTION OF THE EVENT

The Pro Bono Club organised Legal Awareness Camps on Consumer Rights from 30 to 2nd October in Begas, Sanjharia, and Moondia Ramsar, to reach and educate diverse audiences. It was a remarkable camp that brought much-needed awareness to the underprivileged sections of the society about consumer protection. The camp aimed to empower consumers with knowledge and information to safeguard their rights through a systematic and interactive dialogue by esteemed guest speakers specialized in this domain.

The rise in consumer manipulation can be attributed to the unethical tactics employed by vendors driven by their relentless pursuit of profit. These practices have persisted throughout history, prompting authorities to establish rules and laws aimed at curbing such behavior and fostering a transparent and equitable marketplace.

One such milestone was the introduction of the Consumer Protection Act in 1986, which sought to regulate transactions between sellers and consumers, with a focus on ensuring fairness and eliminating corrupt practices. Subsequently, this legislation was replaced by the Consumer Protection Act of 2019, which not only imposed stricter penalties but also broadened its coverage of subjects and conditions.

In a democratic nation like India, safeguarding consumer rights has always been a top priority. This shift in perspective, from "Caveat Emptor" (let the buyer beware) to "Caveat Venditor" (let the seller beware), underscores the commitment to protect, promote, and enforce the rights of consumers as a collective. The primary objective of this Act is to prevent violations of consumers' rights.

The Department of Consumer Affairs, operating under the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food, and Public Distribution, bears the responsibility of upholding consumer rights in India. This department empowers consumers to make informed decisions by disseminating information about the laws that safeguard their interests, their rights and responsibilities. They achieve this through the discussions, lectures, and informative materials like pamphlet, booklet, etc. of informative materials like booklets, brochures, fact sheets, and consumer guides, aiming to educate both the public and licensees.

Furthermore, in pursuit of the Act's objectives, the Pro Bono Club at Manipal University Jaipur organized a legal awareness camp dedicated to enlightening the public about consumer rights and responsibilities.

- Educate about misleading techniques employed by product or service providers and how to detect them.
- Inform about rights available to consumers before and after purchasing a product or service
- Promoting informed decision making by consumers.
- Empowering consumer advocacy in consumer forums and advocate for change



- Promote digital literacy and resources available to consumers
- Empower vulnerable groups to take actionable steps
- Promote interactive platform for dialogue and enhance understanding.

4. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENT

The Legal Awareness Camps on Consumer Rights were organised by the Pro Bono Club of Manipal University, Jaipur. The three days camps were organised keeping in mind the consumer protection amongst the deserving and rural sector of the society.

DAY 1

Day 1 of the event took place in Panchayat Bhavan, Begas, Rajasthan. The camp started at 10:00 AM. Ms. Shruti Jhunjhunwala, Pro Bono Associate, commenced the camp by delivering the welcome address and introducing the event (Day 1). Ms. Upasna Rana, faculty coordinator of Pro Bono Club, MUJ, moderated it.

The keynote speaker graced the session with her presence and began by eloquently elucidating the challenges consumers face due to manipulation and a lack of awareness about their rights. The speaker emphasized the complexity of legal procedures and how this often leaves consumers feeling helpless. The beneficiaries of the camp were informed about the consumer rights provided by Consumer Protection Act, 1986

These rights included Right to safety (like insisting on guarantee and warranty of the product and replace adulterated product), Right to Choose, the Right to be informed, Right to be heard, Right to seek redressal and Right to compensation.

The speaker also asserted the responsibilities or duties of the consumer before and after purchasing a product or availing a service. She provided online resources and websites by sharing helpline numbers and websites for easy access to redressal. The participants were made aware of the consumer courts, which one can approach to seek compensation depending on the value of goods in dispute. Mediation, as an Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR), is also available at their disposal. Lastly, the speaker underscored the importance of enforcing rights available to consumers regardless of their caste, creed, and status and how this contributes to the betterment of society.

At 11:00 AM, the floor was open for questions that witnessed an interactive platform for queries and discussions between the camp beneficiaries and the guest speaker, which was a testament to a successful camp.



The camp concluded with vote of thanks by Ms. Eshita Baghel, faculty coordinator of Pro Bono Club, MUJ. The esteemed guest speaker was honoured and felicitated with memento as a token of appreciation.

DAY 2

Day 2 of the Camp commenced at 11:00AM, on 31st October, 2023 in Government Senior Secondary School Sanjhariya, Jaipur. The welcome address was given by Ms. Shruti Jhunjhunwala, Pro Bono Associate to invite our guest speaker and panel advocate of District Legal Services Authority of Jaipur, Smt. Prabha Agarwal.

She introduced the session to the young students and teachers who were the beneficiaries of the session and were eager to explore this domain of consumer awareness. The session was initiated by understanding the definition of a consumer according to the Consumer Protection Act, 1986. The speaker also highlighted the differences between the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 and the Act of 2019 wherein the latter provided greater benefits of the consumers. The session's efficient moderation was overseen by Ms. Upasna Rana, the faculty coordinator of the Pro Bono Club at MUJ.

Then the students understood the types of manipulation employed by sellers to sell a good or service and how consumers can be aware of the same. The participants were also introduced to the redressal mechanisms available at the district, state, and national levels, providing guidance on the appropriate avenues based on the value of disputed goods.

Consumer rights and duties were an important part of the session. This led to a surge in curiosity among the participants, who actively engaged in raising questions pertaining to the regulation of digital platforms under the Consumer Protection Act, given the prevalence of digital transactions. In clear and accessible language, the speaker elucidated the concept of product liability for digital platforms and intermediaries involved in the sale or promotion of defective goods and substandard services, often through unscrupulous means. Additionally, the session covered the various types of compensation and the methodologies for determining the quantum of damages.

In her closing remarks, the speaker encouraged the participants to raise their voices when confronted with manipulation and underscored the potential for positive change that can be initiated by young students. She urged them not to hesitate and emphasized the impactful role they could play in this regard.

Finally, to express our appreciation, Ms. Eshita Baghel, the faculty coordinator of the Pro Bono Club at MUJ, delivered a heartfelt vote of thanks to honour our esteemed guest speaker. Smt. Prabha Agarwal was recognized for her valuable contributions with a memento as a token of gratitude.

At the conclusion of the session, participants were provided with refreshments and informational booklets, marking the formal closure of the camp at 11:30 AM.



On the 2nd of November 2023, the Legal Awareness Camp on Consumer Rights at Panchayat Bhavan Mundiya Ramsar, Jaipur, entered its third day, commencing at 11:00AM. The honoured guest speaker for this session was Smt. Ashka Rao, who holds the esteemed position of Additional District and Sessions Judge, as well as the Secretary of District Legal Services Authority in Jaipur. The welcome address was delivered by Ms. Shruti Jhunjhunwala, serving as a Pro Bono Associate, who extended a warm invitation to our distinguished guest speaker, known for her vast expertise in the realm of consumer rights and awareness. The beneficiaries of this enlightening day were the local villagers of the district.

The session was inaugurated by the guest speaker, who began by elucidating the fundamental definition of a consumer and shedding light on the significant disparities between the previous and the recent Consumer Protection Acts. In her insightful presentation, she expounded upon how the new Act serves the interests of consumers, affording them greater accessibility to consumer forums for registering their grievances. Participants were apprised of the availability of free and affordable legal aid to facilitate the resolution of consumer disputes.

The distinguished speaker very effortlessly engaged the participants by citing real-life instances of consumer fraud, enhancing their comprehension of the subject matter. The audience was thoroughly engrossed, attentively following the speaker throughout the session. The discussion covered the responsibilities of celebrities endorsing products and underscored the repercussions faced by public figures for propagating false or misleading claims in advertisements. According to the Consumer Protection Act of 2019, celebrities are mandated to enter into agreements ensuring that the products they endorse are free from defects; otherwise, they bear liability for any associated issues.

Furthermore, it was emphasized that product information should be comprehensive, including details such as nutritional value, usage instructions, warranty periods, and manufacturing and expiry dates to maintain transparency. Failure to comply with these standards would result in penalties for the seller. The significance of retaining purchase receipts or bills, which serve as evidence for potential returns and seeking redress and compensation from the seller, was also underscored.

In line with the contemporary technological advancements, the speaker elucidated that dispute resolution can now be facilitated through video conferencing which is an easy and efficient mechanism. Additionally, participants were provided with website details and a helpline number (8306002120) to further assist them in consumer-related matters.

The session drew to a close with the speaker reiterating the paramount importance of consumer awareness. Post-session, the speaker engaged with participants, addressing their individual consumer rights concerns and offering practical solutions. This interaction left the villagers content and well-informed.

To conclude, informative pamphlets and booklets, presented in Hindi for easy comprehension, were distributed among the participants, covering topics related to cyber frauds and their corresponding solutions. Ms. Eshita Baghel, the faculty coordinator of the Pro Bono Club at MUJ, delivered the vote of thanks to honour the esteemed guest speaker.



In a gesture of appreciation, the speaker was honoured with a memento, by Ms. Upasna Rana, the faculty coordinator of the Pro Bono Club at MUJ and moderator of the camp acknowledging her invaluable contributions to the camp.

The camp formally concluded at 12:15 PM, with participants enjoying refreshments as a token of gratitude for their active participation and interest in the session. Overall, the camp undoubtedly contributed to enhancing consumer empowerment and protection to the vulnerable sections of the society and made significant strides in bridging the gap between laws and its implementation at the grassroots of economy.

> ABOUT DISTRICT LEGAL SERVICES AUTHORITIES

Article 39-A came to be inserted in the constitution by amendment Act 1976 with effect from 3.1.1977. It enjoins upon the state to secure that the operation of legal System promotes justice on the basis of equal opportunity and in particular to provide free legal aid by suitable legislation or schemes or in any other way and to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason

of economic or other disabilities. Equal justice to all and free legal aid are hallmark of Article 39-A.

Pursuant to these objectives the Legal Services Authorities Act 1987 was enacted by the Parliament to constitute legal services authorities to provide free and competent legal services to the weaker sections of the society to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities and to organize Lok Adalats to secure that the operation of the legal System promotes justice on a basis of equal opportunity.
