REGISTRATION PROCESS

The Registration process shall be as follows:

- Teams are required to register for the competition from June 20, 2023 to July 10, 2023 by 23:59 IST.

- The Registration form completed with all team details must be submitted online only.
- Once the registration is done Teams will get the confirmation email. Team Codes will be intimated later.
- Participation of the teams in the 9th Manipal Ranka International Moot Court Competition is subject to the acceptance/selection of the memorial and payment of the registration fee. For this purpose, the team will be deemed to have been "formally registered" only upon the payment of registration fee.
- Only upon communication of acceptance/selection of the memorial from the Competition Organisation Committee shall the participants pay a registration fee of INR 7500 (for Indian participants), which includes lodging and food. The participation fee for international participants is USD 100, which includes lodging and food.
- The Link of the Payment will be notified after the communication of acceptance/rejection of memorials to the teams.
- The registration fee is non-refundable and no claim for refund of fee shall be entertained.




Figure 3: Prof. (Dr.) Madhura Yadav, Delivering about the waste management practice

- e) MUJ on its part would share the expertise of its Faculty Members as mutually desirable by way of acting as resource persons for Training Programs or workshops organised by ISTD Jaipur Chapter.
- f) Manipal University, Jaipur (MUJ) will help in propagating the flagship diploma program of ISTD in Training & Development.
- g) Jointly organise Workshops, Seminars, Continuing Education and Training programmes and similar Academic Programmes for Practicing Professionals, Corporate Executives & Faculty Members, Research Scholars and students of MUJ on themes of Topical and Professional interest on self-sustained basis.
- h) Regular exchange of journals published by the parties hereto on a complimentary basis with liberty to reproduce in each other's publications, such portion or portions, which may be of interest, subject to acknowledging the source and under prior intimation and acknowledgement by the other party.
- Regularly exchange course materials, case studies, research publications and other academic and research inputs.
- Reciprocate participation in National and International conferences organised by the parties hereto.
- k) Extend help and Co-operation in developing Curriculum of Academic and Continuing Education Programmes, on such terms as may be mutually agreed to including joint meeting of Curriculum Development Committees/bodies.

- Organise programmes jointly for Training of Trainers (ToT) for mutual benefit and advantage.
- m) ISTD Jaipur Chapter and MUJ would work jointly for Teacher Congruence by organising specialised programmes together.
- Exemptions in University subjects for the students of ISTD JAIPUR CHAPTER in topics such as Corporate Governance if deem appropriate by MUJ.
- o) ISTD Jaipur Chapter at its discretion may co-opt Registrar or any Faculty Member, from MUJ (located in the same jurisdiction of the ISTD Jaipur Chapter) as per its extant Chapter Management Guidelines, 2019 and other applicable Rules, Regulations and Guidelines.
- p) Any other matter of mutual interest including sharing of facilities like infrastructure, library, reading room etc., as may be mutually discussed and agreed based upon a subsequent written document.
- q) Intellectual Property: Unless and otherwise agreed in writing in relation to specific project or academic activities, all intellectual property belonging to a party providing it to other party for obtaining the object of this MoU, during the course of this MoU shall remain the property of the party providing it. Any intellectual property rights created in the course of activities anticipated by this MoU shall be shared equally by both the institutions.

Article II: Duration, Termination and Amendment

- a) The MoU will be effective from the date of signing by both parties for a period of up to five (5) years, and may be subject to extension by mutual consent of the Parties, expressed in writing.
- b) Either party may terminate this MoU by giving one month advance notice in writing to the other Party.


- c) The provisions of the MoU may be amended at any time with the mutual consent of the Parties in writing.
- d) The amendment, termination and expiration of this MoU will not affect the terms of activities ongoing at the time of notification of amendment, termination and expiration, unless otherwise agreed upon between the Parties.
- e) No action undertaken shall diminish the full autonomy of either institution, nor will either party impose any constraints upon the other in carrying out the agreement.

Article III: Special Provisions

- a) During the term of this Memorandum each party may make any press release about the association between the parties. During the term of this memorandum each party agrees to supply information to the other for inclusion in that party's promotional material and agrees to such information being used in each other's promotional material in accordance with such terms as may be specified, but at no cost to the other.
- b) Detailed modalities of individual forms of collaboration, activities associated with them and financial aspects of each shall be mutually agreed upon on a case by case basis, and specified, with all necessary details, in separate Agreements.
- c) This MoU will not be legally & financially binding to any of the Parties. The two Parties will consult with each other and attempt to resolve disputes or misunderstanding that arises in the administration of this MoU or any subsequent associated Agreement informally.
- d) Separate agreement shall be executed with regard to specific project/work initiated in furtherance of this MOU. Financial and other obligations of both the institutions shall be as per that agreement.






4. Brief Description of the event

Manipal University Jaipur (MUJ), a coeducational, residential, a self-financed state university from Jaipur, Rajasthan and the Rajiv Gandhi Centre of Advanced Technology (R-CAT), a Unique IT Finishing School, a Registered Society established by the Government of Rajasthan, desiring to establish collaborative relations between the two institutions to promote partnership, friendship and to co-operate in a mutually beneficial academic association, have agreed to promote interest in the teaching, learning and competency development activities.

- I. The purpose of cooperation between Manipal University Jaipur and R-CAT are as follows:
 - To promote interest in the teaching and learning activities of the respective institutions.
 - To be united by common objectives, and to establish channels for synergy in communications and cooperation.
- II. To achieve these goals, Manipal University Jaipur and R-CAT will do the following insofar as the means of each allow:
 - To carry out joint initiatives to support students, faculty members and staff;
 - Promote institutional exchanges by inviting faculty and staff/trainers/instructors of the partner
 institution to participate in a variety of teaching/training, outreach, innovation, and research
 activities for academic and professional development.
 - To receive students of the partner institution for a particular period of training, live projects and/or internship.
 - Organize Training Programmes, short courses, events, and meetings on educational issues.
 - Carryout joint continuing educational programs

- III. The parties hereto can appoint representatives to carry out the planning of discussions, partnerships, and other programs.
- IV. The present MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) shall be reviewed upon written request by either party at any given time. Modifications are executed and approved through the exchange of letters, which then become addenda to this memorandum.
- V. Pending approval by regulatory authorities, this agreement shall commence on the day that it is signed on behalf of Manipal University Jaipur and R-CAT and shall remain in effect for a period of three (3) years, during which it may be terminated by either institution at any time by giving advance written notice. Such termination by one institution shall be effected by giving the other institution at least one month advance written notice of its intention to terminate. Termination shall be without any penalty to either party. If this agreement is terminated, neither Manipal University Jaipur nor R-CAT shall be liable to the other for any monetary or any other losses that may result because of this termination.




