WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;

Indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;

Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;

Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.

Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.

Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;

Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;

Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student; Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher. And

Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of color, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED:-

Within the University Campus including its Campus/ Departments/ Hostels or/ and any part of MUJ system as well as on public transport system outside the campus.

Prohibited in private lodges/buildings where students are staying.

No person including students/staff/faculty shall participate or abet or propagate ragging in any form.

PUNISHABLE INGREDIENTS OF RAGGING

- Abetment/ criminal conspiracy to rag.
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
- Public nuisance created during ragging.
- Violation of decency through ragging.
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt.
- Wrongful restraint, confinement, use of criminal force.
- Assault as well as sexual / unnatural offences.
- Extortion, criminal trespass, intimidation, humiliation.
- Offence against property.
- Physical or psychological humiliation.
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s).
- Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s).
- All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

PUNISHMENTS

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges;
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits;
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process;
- Withholding results;
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.;
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel;
- Cancellation of admission;
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four
- Semesters;
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to
- any other institution for a specified period.


IF A RAGGING VICTIM LOSES LIFE

304 IPC:-Culpable homicide not amounting to murder

306 IPC:- Abetment to suicide

What is Ragging? Any Act Resulting in:

- Mental/physical/sexual Abuse
- Verbal Abuse
- Indecent Behaviour
- Criminal Intimidation/wrongful Restraint
- Undermining Human Dignity
- Financial Exploitation/extortion
- Use Of Force

A STUDENT INDULGING IN RAGGING CAN BE:

- Cancellation of admission.
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding/withdrawing Scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.
- Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential ragger.


