
# 5<sup>th</sup> Convocation Ceremony of Manipal University Jaipur



Their primary goal is to get admissions for UG, PG and doctoral and across diverse disciplines like Engineering, Architecture & Design (Fashion, Applied Arts, and Interior Design), Business & Commerce, Hotel Management, Management, Law, Journalism & Mass Communication, Basic Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences. Directorate also ensures quality admissions keeping in mind the Manipal legacy of quality education. The admissions in MUJ has been growing consistently since its inception. The student strength in the University in 2011 was 266 which has reached to 7528 (UG & PG) in

2018-19. Directorate not only does admissions but it is also entrusted with the responsibility of awarding scholarships to the meritorious students/ sports persons/ students of academic excellence etc. A total of 309 students across all disciplines were given scholarships on the basis of criteria fulfilled under each category of scholarships. The total amount of Rs 2.27 crore was disbursed for scholarships.

Admissions in general category are done either on the basis of marks obtained in Entrance Test or admissions are done on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination followed by a personal interview. Admissions in NRI/ NRI Sponsored/ OCI/ PIO/ Foreign category are done on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying

examination and recommendation of "Committee for Foreign/NRI admissions.

In order to create awareness about MUJ Programmes, visit to schools and colleges is undertaken to connect with prospective students. MUJ boosts of enrolling the students from Pan India with good presence from Rajasthan, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat.

Directorate also undertakes digital marketing because in the present day, internet has become the primary source for people to search for any information.







Within the Faculty, every school/department has a Board of Studies (BoS). Every BoS and the Academic Council have representatives from academia, industry and alumni.



Academic Council and BoS members ensure that the curriculum of every program is contemporary and has relevance to the local/national/regional/global developmental prerequisites. Whenever it needs, University invites the domain experts; their valuable inputs are deliberated upon in the meetings of Academic Council and BoS and are duly incorporated in the curriculum owing to their merit.

These courses develop magnanimity and commitment amongst students thereby contributing towards development of a wellrounded personality.
- Mandatory industrial training ensures that students are exposed to contemporary industrial trends, innovations, implementation of big data and artificial intelligence in everyday industrial activity. This approach to experiential education addresses the developmental requirements of the country in general, and the local/regional exigencies.
- The University offers work-integrated learning through its large network of corporate partners.
- The postgraduate programs are exemplar of research-academia integration, evidence-based practice and innovation. Our students are in high demand across many sectors.
- The University promotes learning from experts who operate at the cutting edge of each discipline. We don't just teach textbooks, we conduct the work in the textbooks through simulation in our classrooMs
- Our teaching standards are outstanding and being constantly evaluated by students.
- Graduates are proficient in communication and critical thinking skills, quantifiable according to the highest international standards. The students are trained to have an interdisciplinary and global perspective.

- Our Curriculum is designed in the manner that the student will explore a variety of fascinating legal issues while developing skills in understanding, applying and critiquing socio-legal concepts like in the Law programme, 20 weeks internship is



mandatory under any District/Sessional Court, High Court, Supreme Court, NGOs, and Consumer Forums and in Lok Adalats, where students learn the practical aspects of their study. The aspiring legal practitioners provide free paralegal services to nearby villagers and weaker sections of society. In similarly Architecture and Engineering, the students can do their final year project work entirely in the industry under the joint supervision of the industrial personnel and the internal faculty guide.

• To promote foreign languages and facilitate the removal the language barrier which often becomes a hindrance, foreign language courses like German and French have been made a mandatory part of the curriculum in selected programmes and also introduced as certificate and diploma courses.

The Faculty is required to annually upgrade/revise the available curriculum so that the latest technological advances are incorporated in the curriculum as and when needed.

Technology Jammu; Ar. Vijay Garg, Vice President, Council of Architecture; and, Shri Arindam Das, Director, NIFT, Gandhinagar; shared their views on various aspects of revisions required in curriculum. The programme proceeded with presentations from faculty members and student teams. Students presented their "Dream Curriculum", whereas, faculty members presented new curriculum keeping in view the present days challenges. Alumnus of MUJ also participated in this activity and proposed new courses based on the present day challenges they are experiencing. It is one of the features that imbue MUJ with a singular charm, a unique advantage over other university campuses. Social upliftment, Environmental Conservation, Social awareness and technical solutions are some of the many projects which faculty and students take up together as a team in MUJ. University organizes societal welfare programs such as blood donation camps, plantation campaigns and awareness rallies at regular intervals to inculcate moral values in all students and develop the feeling of oneness of individual and their environment; for same cause university has adopted more than 5 nearby villages with aim to enhance awareness among the villagers regarding Health, Hygiene and Sanitation under a programme. Prominent units that determine the effective functioning of university are formed, in which students are major contributors. It helps in solving issues of students in a democratic set up by bridging the gap between University administration and the students. In Student Council, Academic Council, Library Advisory Committee and Class Committee, students are given an opportunity of representation and participation in the student welfare activities, while ensuring a congenial learning environment on the campus.

## Office of Controller of Examinations

#### **Examination at a Glance:**

- Examination are conducted for 39 Undergraduate programs, 20 Postgraduate programs including Ph.D Program.
- Online entrance examinations are conducted towards admission to various postgraduate and undergraduate programs
- Mid Term Examinations (MTE) and End-Term Examinations (ETE) are conducted as per Annual Academic Calendar notified by the Registrar.
- For each exam, the department will prepare the schedule (date, time, venue, etc) for showing evaluated answer booklets to the students in accordance with the Academic calendar and notify the same to the students.
- After end term answer copies showing, the Examination Section will get the initial grades calculated from AMS and send it to the departments for Grade moderation, if needed. A Grade Moderation Committee (GMC) comprises of the HoD and all Course Coordinator of given course is constituted in every department to modify/tweak the grade boundaries in a course, if needed, so that the grading follows a near normal distribution. After moderation the new grade boundaries and grades if any, are sent back to the Examination Section duly approved by Director and Dean, for final notification of result.
- Two Mid Term (sessional) Examinations are conducted for each course as per the Annual Academic Calendar. Re-sessional Examinations are conducted only for those students who are unable to appear in any one or both of the Mid Term Examinations due to some genuine reason, provided

- they have informed the concerned authorities before commencement of examination.
- Make-up Examinations are conducted along with the Regular ETE of a semester only for the courses running in that semester. Students who get F or I grade in a course, are allowed to take these Make-up ExaMs In addition, one more Make-up Examination for theory courses of both Odd/Even semesters are conducted in the month of July every year.
- The Exam Section will notify the results within 15 days of completion of grade moderation after due approval from the Dean of the Faculty /Pro-President. The result of a student will be withheld based on the instructions of the competent authority if he/she has not paid his/her dues (fee and library) or there is a case of disciplinary action pending against him/her.
- Objectives of the department
  - a. Conduction of examination as per the annual schedule of examination.
  - b. Declaration of results as per the calendar.

- 3) Holistic Alumni Directory, where you can explore professional connects within the MUJ Community.







The Directorate is headed by Mr Ajay Kumar Sharma, Director and supported by Dr Santosh Patil, Deputy Director and Dr Praveen Surolia, Assistant Director. A team of faculty members acting as nucleus members further strengthen and support the activities of the Directorate.



The nodal officer and Nucleus member initiates, coordinates and keeps track of activities with respect to the MoU. The nodal officers submit a quarterly report to Advisor-International Programme.

With international tie ups the Directorate facilitates networking of students and faculty across partner institutions and impart training to gain practical experience in international work environment, fast changing industrial scenarios, academic and industrial research. The Directorate organizes and coordinates several activities and programmes to improve social and cultural skills of all stakeholders like International Culture Day, Cross Cultural Culinary workshops, Cultural Immersion Trips and Explore India Programmes. The Directorate on periodic basis organizes presentations and interaction session of academic and industry partners with both students and faculty of MUJ. Interaction of visiting guests with leadership team of MUJ is arranged to further strengthen the ties at the highest level leading to MoU's or Agreements. Departmental heads confirm credit exchange possibilities & parity (Credit Mapping) in terms of courses on offer during the semester. Students and faculty of partner institutes willing for association with MUJ are always welcome. Manipal University Jaipur has over 66 Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed with Universities and Institutes from USA, UK, France, Australia, Russia, Malaysia, Germany, New Zealand, Portugal, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Nepal, Poland, Serbia, Singapore, South Africa, Switzerland, Ukraine and Thailand. Out of these 22 MoU have been signed in 2018-19. With many more MoU in the pipeline, MUJ is striving to leave its impression across the globe.



  an insight on Conservation and History as well as they were introduced to a different perspective towards design.



#### NEW POLICIES/INITIATIVES

#### Faculty Award Incentive for Research (FAIR)/Publication & Research Award Incentive for Students to Excel (PRAISE)

Directorate of Research (DoR) initiated 'Faculty Award Incentive for Research' (FAIR) and 'Publication & Research Award Incentive for Students to Excel' (PRAISE) to encourage both faculty members and students to publish their research papers in Scopus indexed journals to improve the quality and citation of research publications.

#### **Policy on Intellectual Property Rights**

Intellectual Property Rights Cell (IPR-Cell) has been introduced by DoR to facilitate the protection and upliftment of intellectual properties generated during the scientific pursuit in the university and offer scope for ingenuity and commercialization. There will be incentive award for the granted patents. Manipal University Jaipur initiated technical and financial support to the staff for filing a patent or design or any other form of IPR

### Dr. Ram Das Pai Scholarship

DoRhas initiated Dr Ramdas Pai Scholarship for full time PhD research scholars to facilitate and promote research at MUJ. Under this scholarship, a full time research scholar may be offered Rs 15000/- per month in the first year, Rs 25000/- in the second and the third year respectively.

#### **Author Institutional Affiliation Guidelines**

'Author Institutional Affiliation Guidelines' were introduced by DoR to ensure that the university receives full recognition for the work in the international ranking and other research evaluations. As researchers at Manipal University Jaipur make significant contribution to the global research, they need to ensure the correct and consistent use of university affiliations 'Manipal University Jaipur' in their research outputs.

### **Central Analytical Facility**

Central Analytical Facility (CAF) has become operational now at the university premise. CAF houses sophisticated instruments including Atomic absorption Spectroscopy (AAS), Gas Chromatography—Mass Spectrometry (GC-MS), High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), Thermogravimetric Analysis (TGA), UV-Vis Spectrophotometer and Fourier Transform Infrared spectroscopy (FT-IR).

#### Research Data Management System (RMS)

Research Management System (RMS) has been introduced and implemented by DoR to streamline the research activities, data verification process and data monitoring at Manipal University Jaipur.

#### **Plagiarism Detection Service**

DoR has procured Plagiarism Detection Service (TURNITIN) for similarity checking of research documents. All research related documents (conference papers, journal papers etc.) can be checked through this software. All the faculty members have been given the individual access to the same.








## **Directorate of E-Cell**

Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation center and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge. Manipal University Jaipur has a large pool of talented students and faculty members. The University has made its presence felt amongst the highest echelons of the who's who of the world of Technology and Engineering in such a manner that, Atal Innovation Mission, NITI Aayog, Government of India sanctioned instituting Atal Incubation Centre at the university premises. DST, Government of Rajasthan, acknowledging the University as the Centre of Excellence, has designated it as Technological and training center.

E Cell, MUJ incubates Start Ups to encourage student to turn into entrepreneurs. In order to motivate students to come up with innovative ideas, proposals are invited all through the year. Applicants for admission in incubation center will be required to submit a preliminary application to the convener's office. Applicants are required to disclose information on executive involvement of the promoters / founders in other start – ups / companies or commercial entities. The expert committee reviews the application based on pre-determined criteria: Merit of the business proposal, financial viability; Status of the business plan, market research and feasibility studies; Growth potential; Applicant's commitment-both financial and personal time-to the venture. After pre incubation / incubation, E Cell regularly monitors the Start Ups. If the Start Ups are not being able to maintain the regular activities in their projects and remain silent or inactive for more than 3 months, they are assigned the inactive status.

The E-Cell at MUJ has been organizing a three-day fest since 2016 to encourage and provide a platform to the young talent of MUJ as well as other institutions, to promote awareness about entrepreneurship. It includes activities like B Plan competitions, Intern fair, Innovriti, talk sessions, IPL auction, networking events, B plan making workshops etc. It also organizes workshops and seminars on Intellectual Property Rights and Geographical Indications, funded by Department of Science & Technology, Rajasthan.

To meet to the expectations of the stakeholders and expand the innovation ecosystem, the University started E-Cell in 2014, which has been nurturing the ideas of students to make viable industry products. E-cell guides the technical student clubs like CSI student branch, ACM student chapter, IEEE student branch, IEI Civil, RPM, DIY, WINGS, Tractrix, IMechi, Robotics, Innovaders, Science Club, Panecea, to name a few. In addition, the E-Cell; a catalyst of change, incorporates and spreads awareness about Government policies by interfacing with the government bodies like NSDC etc. to incubate the student ideas. The University has incubated around 39 start-ups till date, some of which have graduated and attracted public and private bodies for funding. 18 Start-ups were incubated in the session 2018 -19. With the initial support funding from the government and industry, the University is looking forward to develop a healthy innovation ecosystem.




# **Training & Placement**

MUJ-TEC organized an FDP orienting the faculties of MUJ on 'Outcome Based Learning (OBE) and its implications in day-to-day teaching learning activity' from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Prof S.N. Bhat, OBE expert, MIT MAHE, was the resource person. He interacted with 235 MUJ faculties, in five batches, for OBE implementation in enhancing teaching learning effectiveness.

## Introduction to OBE (Course Plan)

MUJ-TEC organized two workshops on introduction to OBE on 25<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2018 and 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> August 2018 at MUJ for 151 invited faculties of MUJ. This workshop explored in the following area: • Write Course Outcomes to map with Program Outcomes in Articulation Matrix • Develop Lesson Plans to select method of teaching to deliver Lesson Outcomes •



Mapping Assessment Questions (MTE and ETE) to Course Outcomes in Attainment Matrix • Measuring Course Outcome Attainment Prof S N Bhat, MAHE, and Prof Raghu Vir Singh, TSB, MUJ were the resource persons. A total of 166 faculties participated in the workshop.

#### Has the Flipped Classroom Flopped?

MUJ-TEC organized a mini workshop, facilitated by Dr K Ramnarayan, Chairperson, Manipal University Jaipur, on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 at MUJ for 56 participants. Prof. K Ramnarayan discussed the use of flipped classroom, its utility and viability as an effective instructional method under the following themes. • Essential ingredients of the flipped classroom • Preparation, precautions and pitfalls while implementing it • Integration of the flipped classroom in our academic settings.

#### Sculpting an Academic Teaching Portfolio

Three mini-workshops on 'Sculpting an Academic Teaching Portfolio' was organized by MUJ-TEC on 7<sup>th</sup> June, 27<sup>th</sup> July, and 6<sup>th</sup> September, 2018. The workshop focused on the following themes: • Conceptualize educational scholarship • Document teaching effectiveness • Utilize these documentation standards for professional growth • Make educational activities valued and visible Prof K Ramnarayan addressing the participants said, "Teaching effectiveness and educational attainments need to be documented not merely for self-improvement but also for the career advancement of an educator. Unsurprisingly, this is not easily accomplished." A total of 145 faculties participated in the workshop.

#### **Assessment**

MUJ-TEC organized a two-day workshop on principles and practices of effective student assessment for the faculties of IIS University, Jaipur on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> December, 2018 at IIS University, Jaipur. Prof K Ramnarayan, Chairperson, MUJ & Vice President, Faculty Development, MAHE and Prof Prashanti Eachempati, HoD of Prosthodontics, Melaka Manipal Medical College, Melaka, Malaysia & Adjunct Professor, MUJ-TEC were the resource persons.

# **Directorate of Quality and Compliance**

## **Strategic Roadmap Deployment**

In 2017-18, 26 faculty handpicked across all programs were assigned the task to develop a strategic roadmap to identify key initiatives for improving our NIRF ranking from 151-200 band to TOP 100 by 2022-23. Annual measurable milestones were developed based on NAAC and NIRF parameters. These milestones formed the basis of our Quality System's Key Performance Indicators (KPI). All departments aligned their goals to this common set of KPIs for achieving our strategic roadmap milestones. Directorates were established as process owners to ensure standards and remove any roadblocks a department may encounter. Process data collected from this measurement system is reviewed at two leadership meetings – Deans & Director Monthly Structured Meeting and Section Heads/Directorates Monthly Structured Meeting. Countermeasures to improve quality system performance are put in meeting minutes for subsequent follow-up and closure. Faculty and Staff annual performance appraisal goals are aligned to their department's KPI to ensure execution and milestone achievement.

#### **Outcome Based Education in both Engineering and Non-Engineering Programs**

Since the new NAAC guidelines released in July 2017 introduced requirements for measuring program outcomes for non-engineering programs besides what was traditionally required for engineering programs, a massive training initiative was required. Each department nominated OBE coordinators to be trained as mentors for developing program outcome articulation and attainment matrices. Each faculty developed course outcomes mapping to their program's outcomes and lesson outcomes were mapped to course outcomes. Hands on workshops were conducted by MUJ Teacher Empowerment center for writing course plans and selecting pedagogic methods with appropriate assessment techniques. Attainment thresholds were established so that each department's OBE coordinator could measure their program attainment and improvements required for specific courses. By introducing program outcome attainment goals as a department's Key Performance Indicator, leadership can review and suggest improvement during Dean & Directors Monthly Meetings for reporting to Academic Council.

#### **Program Outcomes Attainment Review**

All programs at Manipal University Jaipur have adopted NAAC guidelines established in July 2017 for learning outcomes, including engineering and non-engineering programs. These learning outcomes are called Program Outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes and are based on Graduate Attributes established by Washington Accord. Program Outcomes attainment are measured by each department using a common standard workbook to capture students course outcomes attainment versus a threshold set by their course teacher. Since Program Outcome attainment percentage is a key performance indicator (KPI) for academics, it is reviewed by Deans and Directors every semester and at the end of an academic year. Improvement actions at the course level are monitored at various levels beginning with a Department's OBE coordinator and then at the School Director's level for reporting to their Faculty Dean during mid-year and year end KPI reviews. Faculty Deans and Directors then review their respective program attainment performance with the Vice Chancellor and Pro Vice Chancellor along with Directorate of Academics and Directorate of Quality & Compliance.

#### Teaching Learning Process Review - Student Satisfaction Survey Analysis

Survey responses from students about their satisfaction with teaching learning process is conducted after 2 weeks of classes beginning and two weeks before classes end every semester. These responses are analyzed for common strengths and weaknesses across all programs to identify initiatives to improve satisfaction levels. Individual departments analyse their student responses with each class committee to identify specific actions that can be implemented during the semester and before a new semester begins. This cycle is repeated every semester to strengthen our teaching learning processes by introducing new pedagogic methods and assessment techniques.

# Rain water harvesting structures and utilization in the campus

MUJ has initiated and executed the rooftop rainwater harvesting in all the buildings of the university, including hostels. Rainwater is collected from rooftops of buildings from existing sources which are connected to a common header and led to a trickling sand filter. The filtered water is then used for domestic purpose after chlorination. Rainwater harvesting is also done by diverting storm water

drains towards ponds in order to recharge the ground water.

University has four rainwater storage ponds with capacity of 16625 KL and six water tanks with the capacity of 700 KL. The water which gets stagnated on low lying road outside the university compound wall is also channelized to these storage tanks.

All drains are provided with filters for allowing water to reach the soil and thus keep increasing/sustaining ground water level. This helps in recharging the ground water.

#### Solid waste management:

Waste management & recycling helps the campus to achieve its goal to reduce the amount of waste production. There are more than 740 recycling bins on the campus which are used to collect paper, plastic and aluminum cans,

newspaper and cardboard waste, for recycling. Although, the university diverts more than 50% of its waste to landfills, but the goal is to reach 70% before 2020.

MUJ recognizes the importance of its role in working with its supply chain and others, which can help to avoid or minimize the waste generation by working with the waste collection authorities. The university is committed to best practices in reducing and managing waste effectively and innovatively and integrating this policy within all department, at all levels. #### **!** Liquid waste management

#### 1. Water Management

Overnight leak tests, by taking meter reading before and after a period of occupancy is done to identify any leaks or overflows occurring in the building. The specification and design of all water systems enable the management staff to monitor the system by remote means. While good design of water systems will reduce the amount of water used at MUJ, the habits of the students and staff at the university are critical and instrumental to bring about transformational change. University operates an irrigation monitoring program, specifically designed to conserve water and reduce runoff from the campus. The irrigation schedule is administrated by an advanced automated central control system based on historical irrigation practices.

Targets to be achieved from water consumption:

- To Reduce the unit cost of water
- To Reduce the volume of mains water used
- > Water monitoring
- To Investigate its own sources

#### 2. Waste water treatment

Waste Water treatment process facilitates the treatment of

existing contaminants in the water or reduces the concentration of such contaminants so that the water becomes fit for the desired use.


The average waste water generated in the campus is 1837 KLD. The average waste water treated in the 4 STPs (1850 KLD Plant) is 1670 KLD. The entire treated water is used for toilet flushing, watering the gardens and maintaining lawns in the campus. The sludge settled in the STPs is removed four times a month and is composed and used as manure for the gardens. Thus, the entire waste water which is generated in the campus is treated and used.


#### **&** E-Waste management

E-waste collected at the site is transferred for wiping or recycling to the local vendors on monthly basis. Students are encouraged to dispose of any unwanted electronics with IT Dept.

Examples of electronic waste:

- TVs, computer monitors, printers, scanners, keyboards, mics, cables, television tubes (CTRs) etc.
- Kitchen equipment (toasters, coffee maker, microwave ovens)
- Laboratory equipment



#### **Library Resources**



Manipal University Jaipur's Central Library is the hub for academic information services in the University and serves as a major Learning Resource Centre. The Central Library has a spacious area of 2319 Sq m that exudes peaceful learning environment. The Library is fully air-conditioned with the seating capacity of 450. The Central Library has various sections like Circulation Desk, Technical Section, Reference Section, Book stack area-Engineering, Books stack area-Non engineering, Periodical section, and has five discussion rooms. Further, the Library has Digital library, Back volumes section, Project reports section, Thesis section, Research Wing, Competitive Exam section, and an Open Reading Hall.

Apart from the Central Library, Faculty of Design, and Faculty of Art & Architecture have separate Libraries with a seating capacity of 100 each, and every School of the University has its own department Libraries.

#### **Library Collection**

The Library has a collection of 57800 books with 14500 titles on various subjects and over 3000 reference books covering atlases, biographies, dictionaries, directories, encyclopaedias, handbooks, manuals, yearbooks, as well as other reference books. It subscribes about 300 national and 50 international print journals and holds over 450 project reports and 50 Ph.D Theses.

The Central Library added 7120 books at a cost of INR

36.06 Lacs, Faculty of Design Library added 476 books at a cost of INR 15.89 Lacs, and Faculty of Arts & Law Library added 1174 books at a cost of INR 5.68 Lacs during the year 2018-19.

#### Rare Books

Rare Book collection of the Manipal University Jaipur consists of books, manuscripts, and reports maintained in the Central Library to support the information needs of the students, faculty and the research scholars for their specific study and reference purposes. The Central Library holds about 1000 books in its rare book collection from the year 1800, available in the form of e-book collections and in the Institutional Repository. They include the documents on Indian Constitution, Britain & Russian constitutions, Ancient Indian culture, various regimes, dynasties, cultures, religions and subjects like astronomy, economy, literature, science and Technology etc.

#### Library e-Resources

The Digital Library has 15 computers and subscribed 20 E-Resources for the year 2018-19 at a cost of INR 120.11 Lacs, include 17900 e-journals, manuals, reports, standards, and other information from ASCE, ASME, EBSCO Art & Architecture Complete, EBSCO Business Elite, EBSCO Hospitality & Tourism Complete, Emerald Premier e-journals, Taylor and Francis, DELNET-Proquest, DELNET-INFOTRAC, IEEE, SIAM Journals, LexisNexis,



Manupatra, Supreme Court Cases, AIR online, EPW India Times, Mc GrawHill Science & Engineering Access, Science Direct, and World E-Books. The Digital library holds about 2500 CDs and DVDs.

#### **Library Services**

The Library is kept open from 8 am to 11 pm on weekdays and 9 am to 6 pm on Saturday, Sunday and other holidays. The UG and PG Students can borrow 3 books for the period of 15 days. The Research Scholars and faculty can borrow 8 books for the period of 3 months. The Central Library extends photocopying and printing service of few pages of books, journal articles, and previous years' University question papers at a nominal charge.

#### Remote Access with Mobile App

The Central Library provides off campus access to all its subscribed contents to the students, faculty, and research scholars through username and password using knimbus software. Further, the library has implemented mobile App facility and the users can access all library resources through mobile technology.

#### **Institutional Repository**

The Central Library has established an Institutional Repository using Dspace: A Digital Library Software. Faculty Publication, Institution Publications, Conference Proceedings, Lecture Notes, Video Lectures, Course Syllabus, Previous year question papers, Project Reports, Theses, etc. are made available in the Institutional

Repository.

#### **Academic Integrity**

The Central Library extends research support to the researchers and faculty by providing Turnitin: A Plagiarism checking software. Further, the library is an institutional member in INFLIBNET and accessing URKUND plagiarism checking software also.

#### **Institutional Member**

The Central Library is aMember of DELNET, INFLIBNET, e-ShodhSindhu, ShodhGanga, Current Science, Indian Academy of Social Sciences, British Council Library, and American Library and the users are accessing these library services.

#### Library Automation and Security

The central Library employs RFID technology for access control, automatic issue and return of library documents, and stock verification of library holdings. The library has Koha: An Open Source Library Management Software for all library operations from the year 2018.






